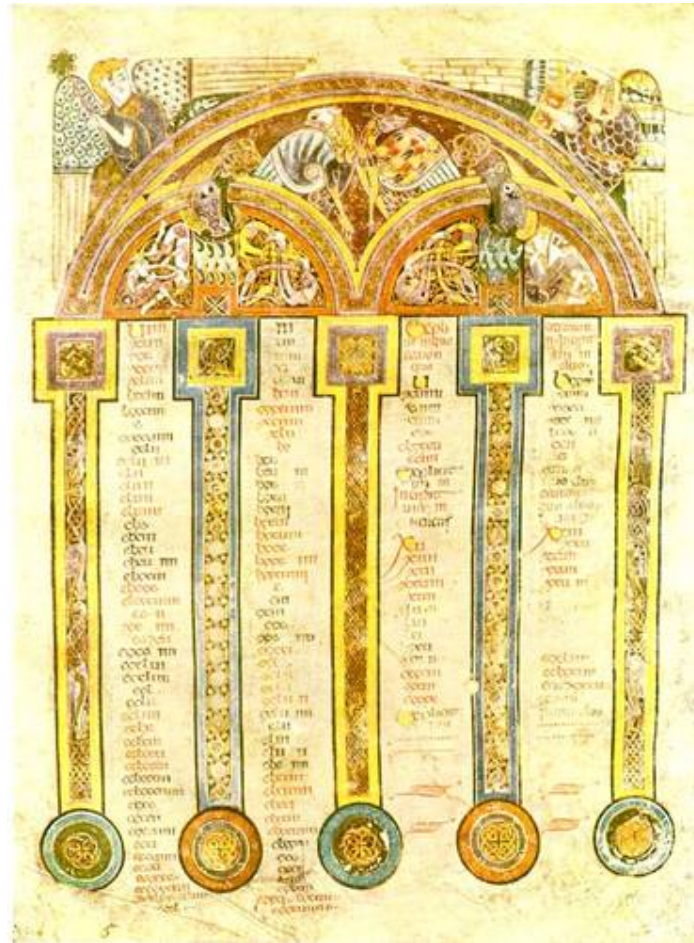
Map of Great Britain and Ireland

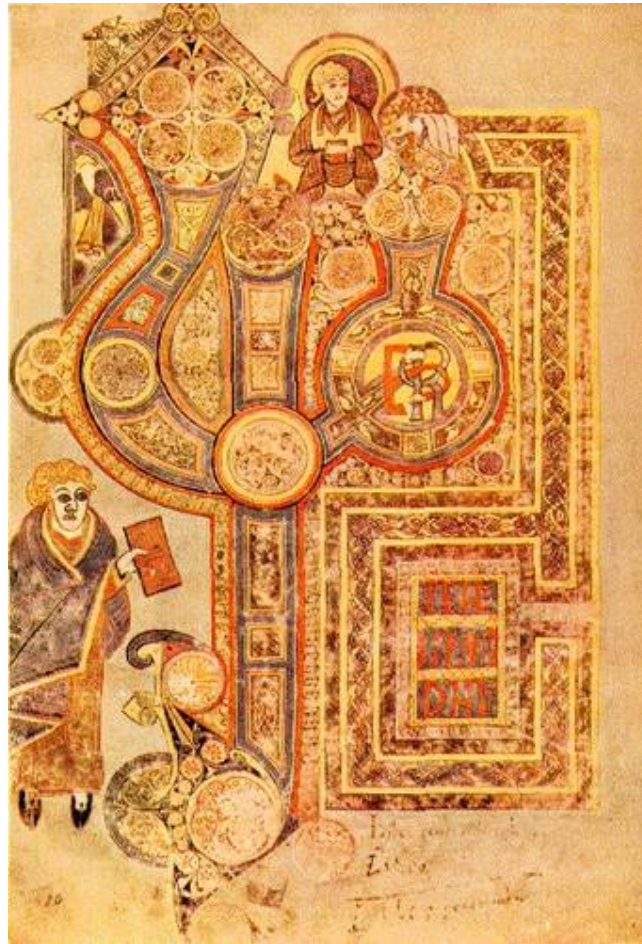

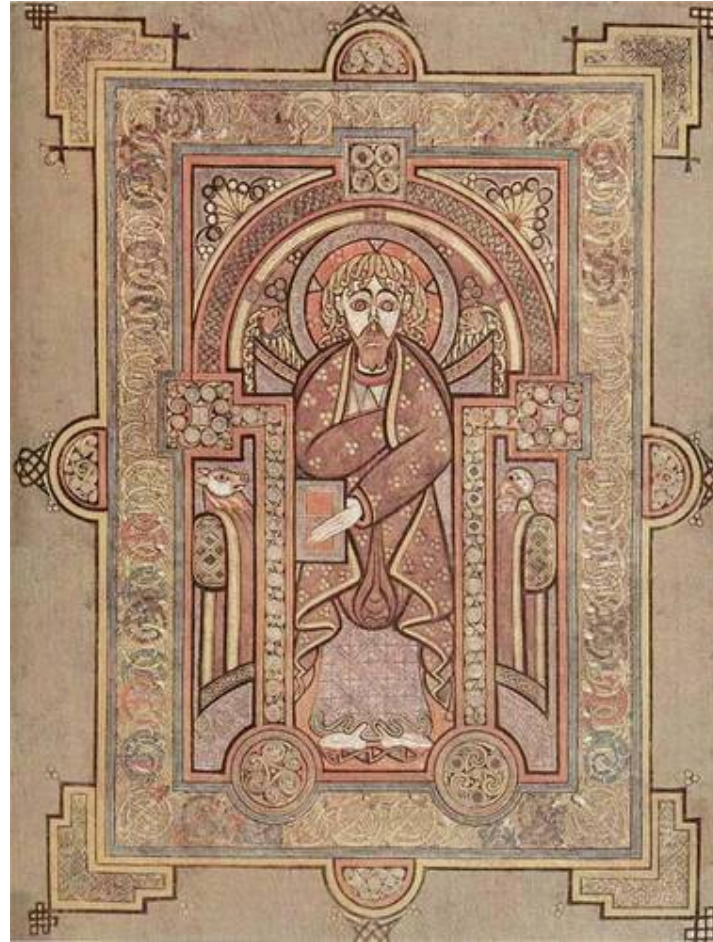

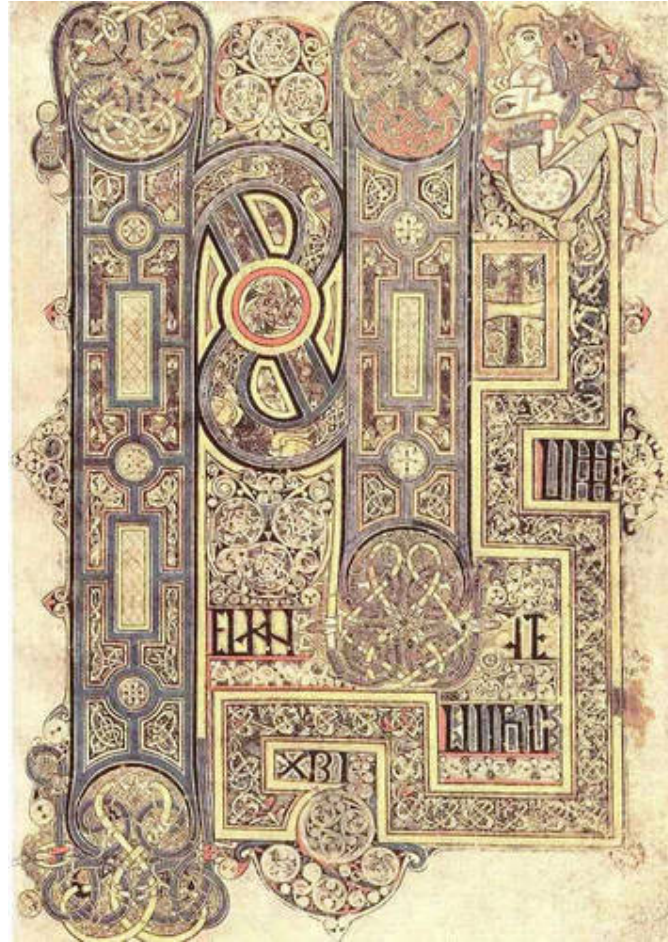

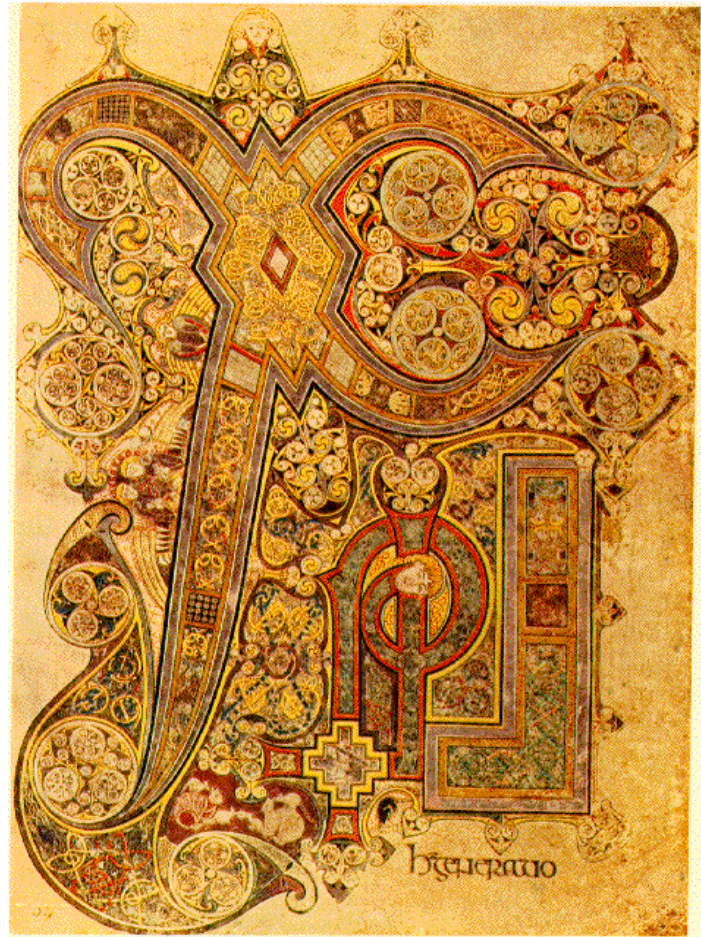

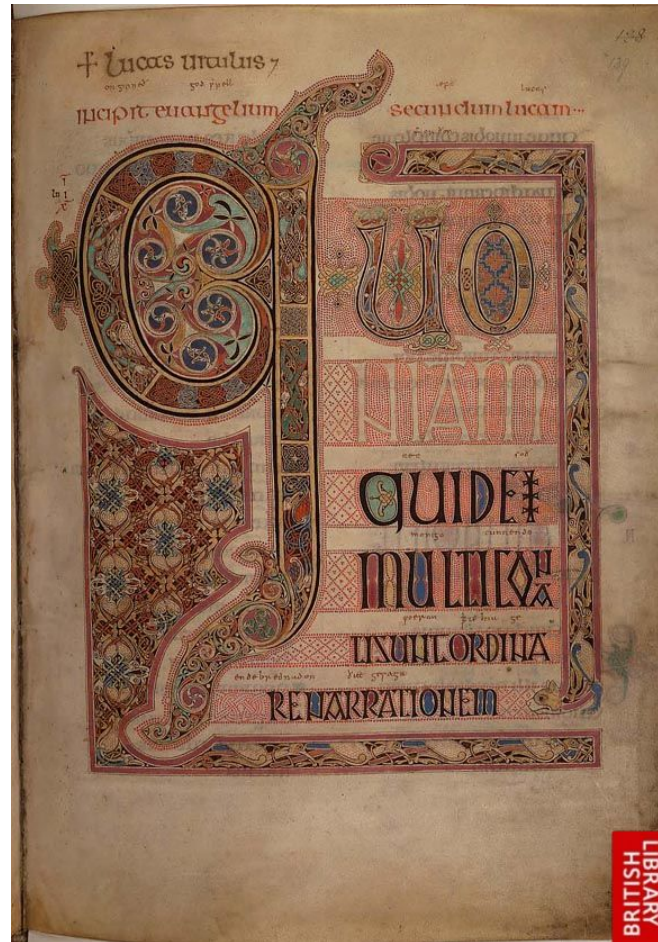

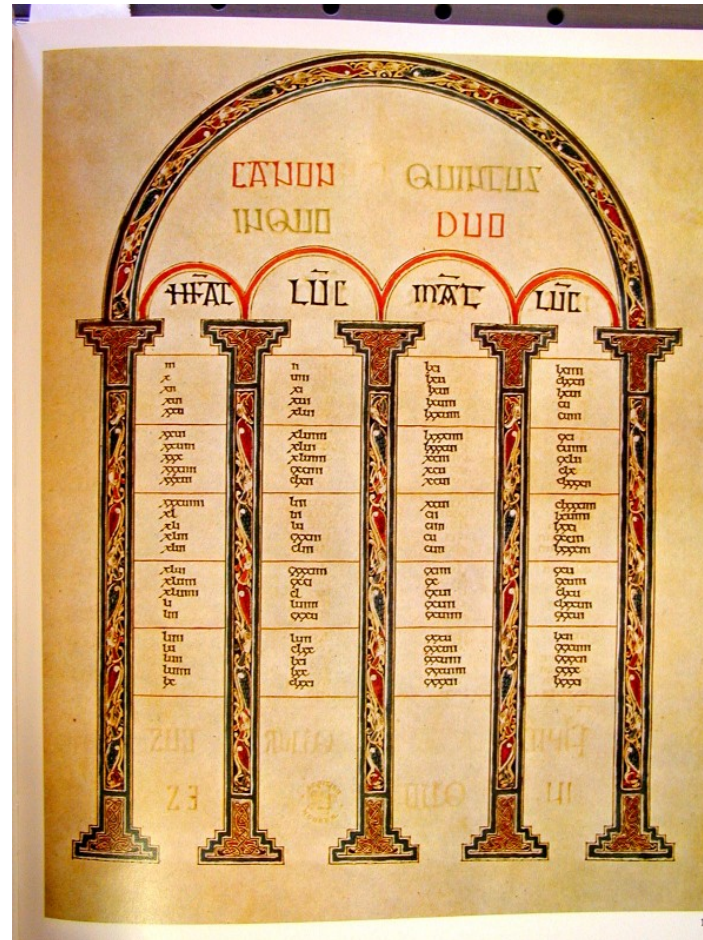

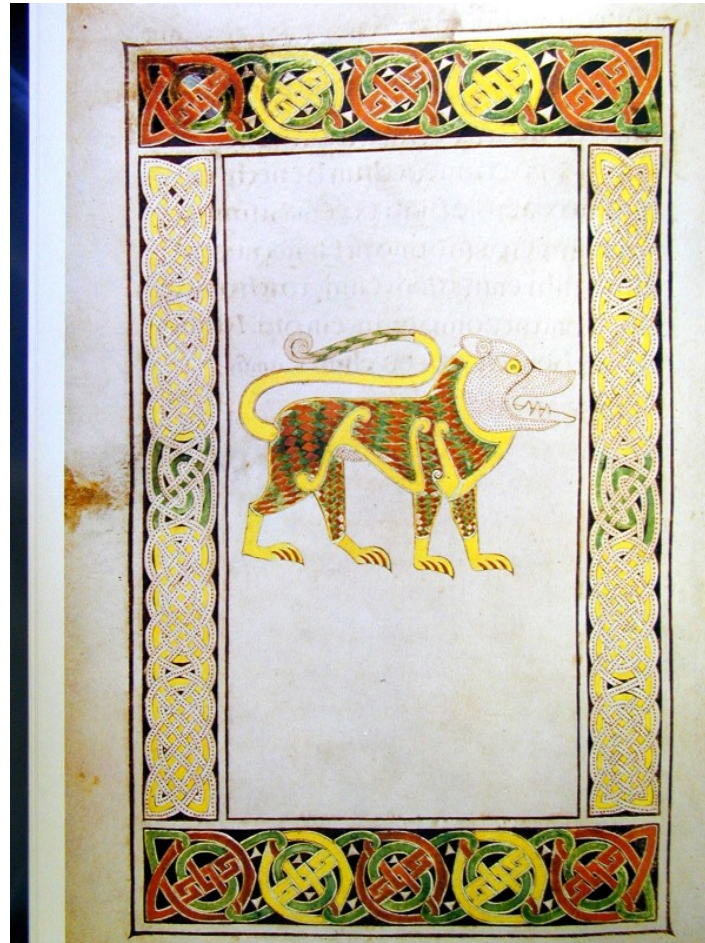

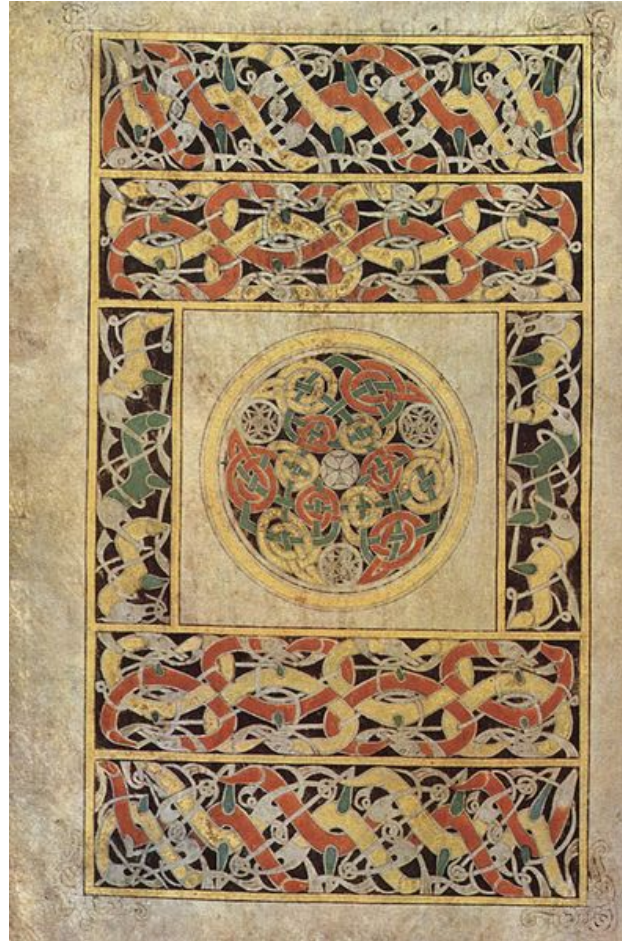

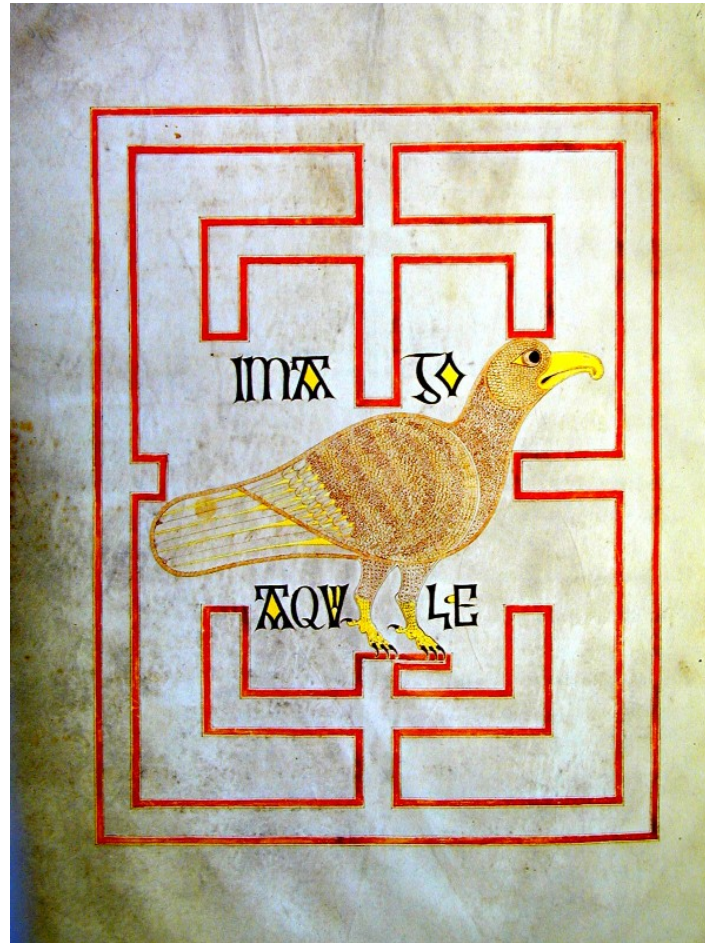

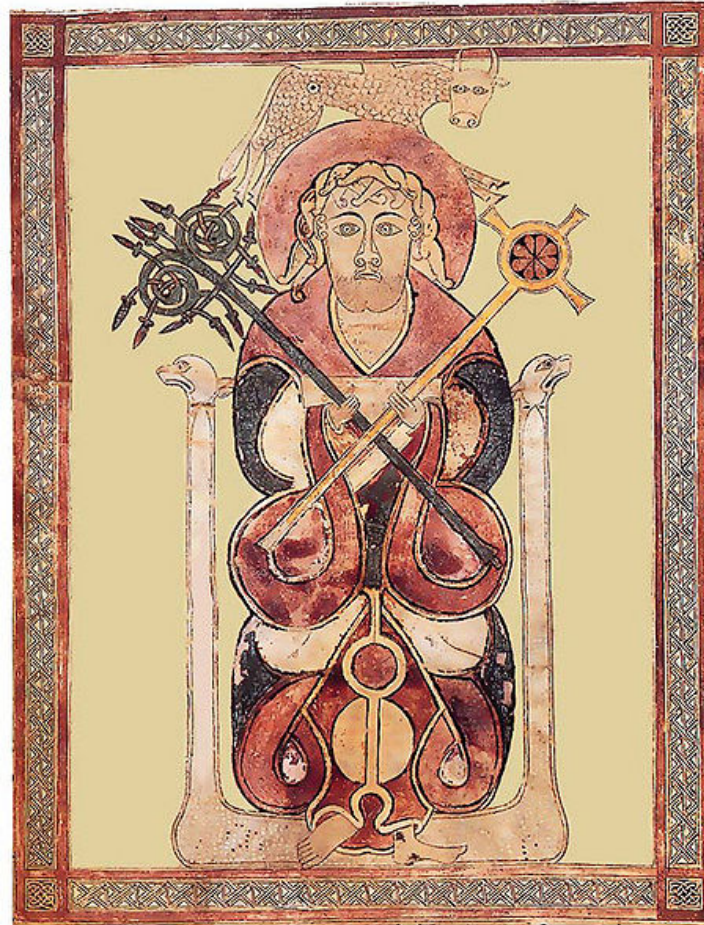

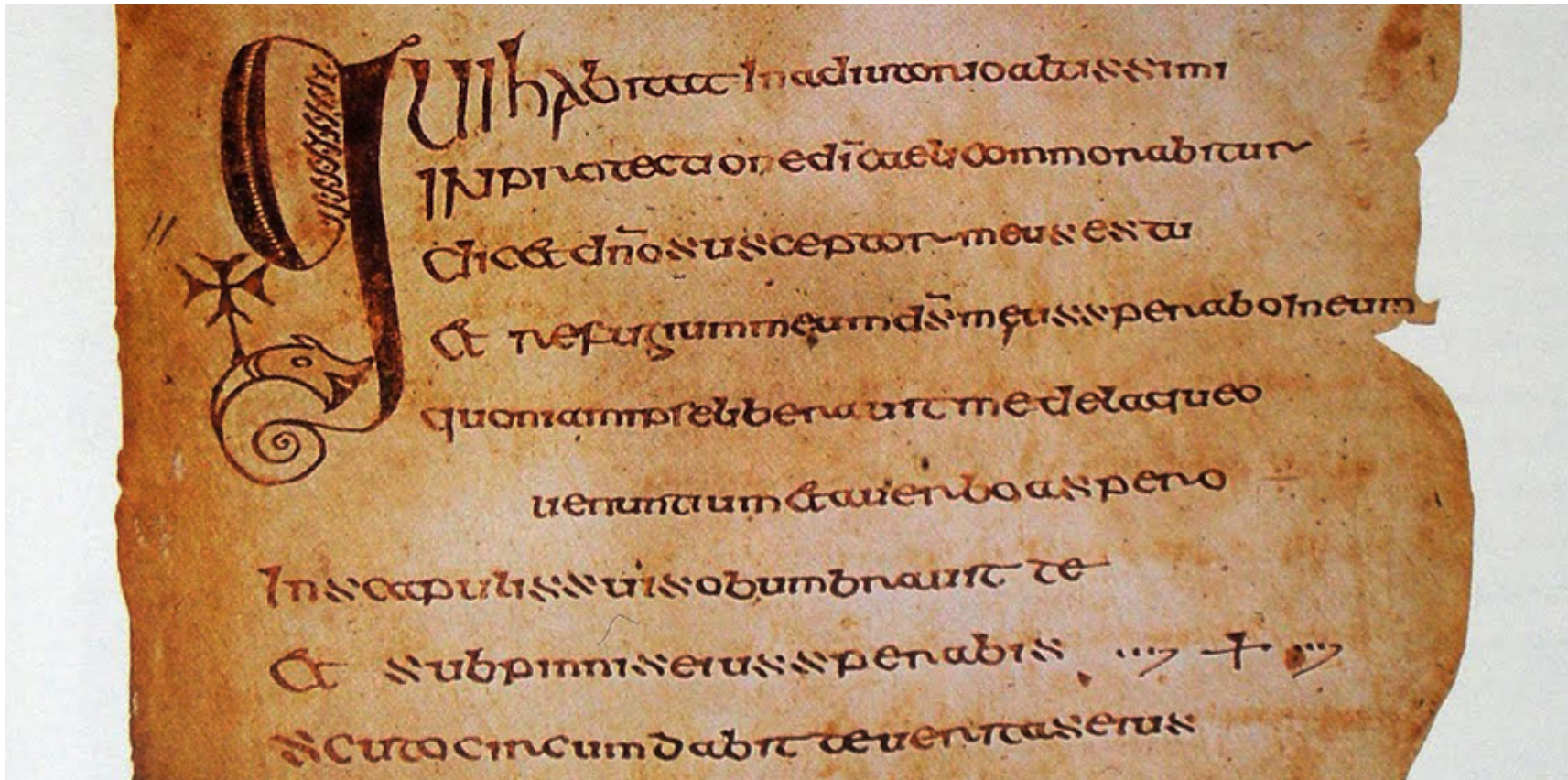

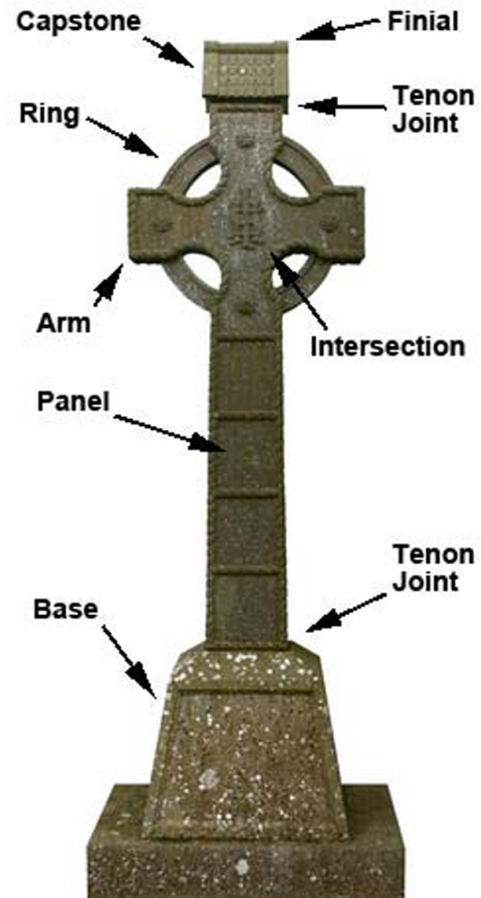
